## A safe place for children and youth.

Toba Centre for Children & Youth (formerly Snowflake place) was created to provide a safe, child-friendly setting for child victims and their caregivers to meet with service providers, and where children were interviewed by highly trained forensic interviewers. 2019 marked the beginning of our transformation to a fully co-located, coordinated response to child abuse in Manitoba. This evolution included expanding our services beyond forensic interviewing, to providing case navigation support services for the children, youth, and families we serve. Since opening in 2014, we have conducted over 3,300 forensic interviews with children who have experienced abuse or been witness to violence and over the past year, our case navigation program has supported nearly 600 families.

# Board Chair and Executive Director

On behalf of the Board of Directors, staff, and volunteers at Toba Centre, we are pleased to present our 2022 Annual Report. What a year it has been! While we have been keenly focused on fulfilling the longstanding vision for Toba Centre to become a first-class child advocacy centre for Manitoba, we could not have anticipated the incredible movement that has transpired.

We started the year with the launch of our We Will Capital Campaign to fund the renovations of our new home in Assiniboine Park and raised nearly 10 million dollars in 2022! Premier Stefanson announced a lead gift of an incredible \$2 million from the Province of Manitoba and our community stepped up in ways we could not imagine, allowing us to raise nearly 8 million additional dollars. The We Will Capital Campaign will continue into 2023 until we reach our goal of \$15 million. We can do this Manitoba!

While we were working hard to raise the necessary funds, the new Toba Centre at 710 Assiniboine Park Drive was being constructed and is set to open to children, youth, and families in 2023. It has been an incredibly busy time, managing the construction of the new 19,000 square foot facility, where every detail was driven by our intent to be as trauma informed, child/youth and family-centred and as inclusive as possible. Extraordinary effort was put in to ensuring the space met the needs of our partners in criminal justice, child pro-

tection, health care, and mental health services. While we wish children and families never required our services, we are pleased that we will be able to provide the type of environment children and families deserve in their time of need.

But the space is just our platform to change how we work, and our partners have embraced this opportunity. RCMP 'D' Division, Manitoba First Nations Police Service, and Brandon Police Service came together with Toba Centre to develop a business

case for a new integrated child abuse unit. In March 2023, the Province of Manitoba announced the necessary funding to create this new integrated unit that will be developed and located at Toba Centre. The Province also doubled the ongoing operating funding to Toba Centre commencing in 2023 to enable us to provide coordination of child abuse response across justice, child welfare, health care, and victim support services. This

funding allows Toba Centre to provide the type of wrap around and ongoing supports children, youth, and families need to thrive beyond abuse. We are grateful.

At the same time as we work towards building our new home and our new model of service delivery, the work of Toba Centre continued at 225 Portage Avenue and we saw an unprecedented demand for our services. Over 500 children attended Toba Centre throughout the year where they participated in forensic interviews and where their care

providers received support from Toba Centre's case navigators. Great efforts were made throughout the year to start developing new ways to work in the best interests of vulnerable children. New collaborations were developed, new trainings offered, and new partnerships formed. The Toba Centre team continues to grow and we are proud of the incredible group of dedicated, hardworking, and specialized professionals who work so hard for the children and youth we serve every day.

While our work is never easy, it has been an incredible journey to watch all the ways in which our community is beginning to rally around Toba Centre and the children and families we serve. In June we were thrilled to welcome Winnipeg Jets Centreman, Adam Lowry, as our new Toba Centre Ambassador. Adam has jumped in with both feet, not only taking the time to learn as much as he can about child abuse in Manitoba, but lending his voice, his time, and his heart to this issue.

Our second annual Golf FUNdraiser, sponsored by Bockstael Construction, generated \$170,000 to support our We Will campaign. And throughout October, in recognition of Child Abuse Awareness Month, we raised awareness about child abuse and the important role communities play in keeping children and youth safe through our first annual All Kids Deserve a Team #GoBlueToba campaign. Our goal throughout the month was to send

a message to children and families impacted by abuse that we stand with them and support them as a community. Community stepped up in so many amazing ways - from lighting up blue, to wearing blue, to promoting the campaign in local business, to sharing social media messages. The message was loud and clear, we were all standing in solidarity with, and honouring the resiliency of those impacted by child abuse. We closed the month with our inaugural #GoBlueToba FUNdraising event held at the Wood Tavern and generating over \$135,000 in critical funds for the We Will campaign.

As a child advocacy centre, the new Toba Centre will allow for the co-location of all the necessary systems that respond to children and youth who have experienced abuse. It will be the complete wrap around child abuse response centre that it was always meant to be and it will come to life in 2023. But 2022 has taught us that it is so much more than that. We have learned that the role of community should never be underestimated. Our community is not only helping us raise the funds to build this new centre, but our community will pave the way for the children and families we serve. Toba Centre is the place where community will rally around hurt children and their families and make sure that these children have every opportunity to thrive beyond abuse.

# Hearing, helping, and healing

Toba Centre coordinates a collaborative approach to child abuse response utilizing an internationally recognized child advocacy centre model. Our current location offers a child-friendly space where we bring together law enforcement, child welfare, and Toba Centre staff to coordinate a child's forensic interview and provide specialized support to children and their caregivers/families as they navigate both the systems involved in the response to child abuse, as well as their individual journeys towards healing and justice.

Currently, Toba Centre receives referrals exclusively from law enforcement agencies. In 2022/23, Toba Centre received:

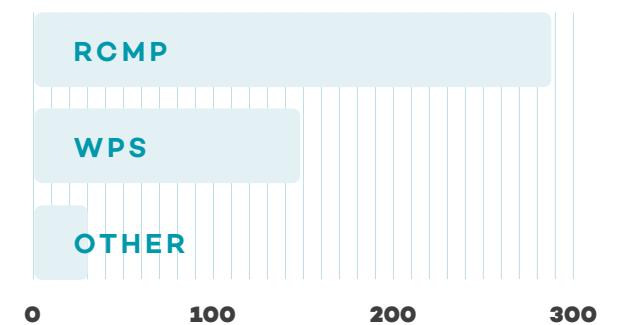

Coordinated intervention by the multidisciplinary team helps to reduce potential trauma to children and families and improve services overall.

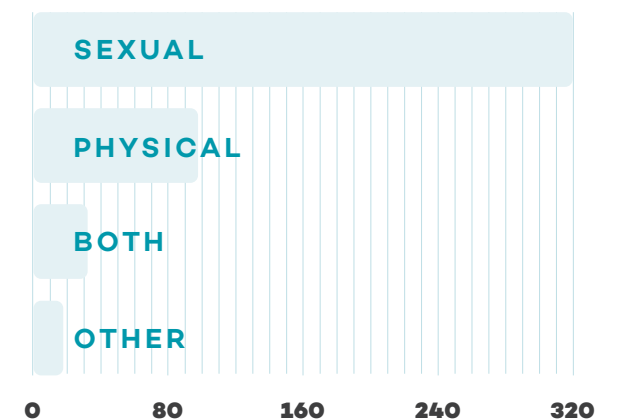
The multidisciplinary team, composed of representation from law enforcement, child protection, and Toba Centre Forensic Interviewers and Case Navigators, meets at the time of the forensic interview, to ensure all partners have the information they need to make informed decisions in their respective disciplines. During the 2022/23 fiscal year, 79.6% of multidisciplinary team meetings included representation from law enforcement, child welfare, and Toba Centre staff.

At this time, there is no referral criteria set in place for Toba Centre. Children who come to Toba Centre may not be representative of all reported cases of child abuse.

# Forensic Interviews

The purpose of a forensic interview is to “facilitate information gathering from children to determine whether abuse occurred and, if so, the nature of the allegations” with the intention this information will “contribute to accurate and fair decision-making by the multidisciplinary team members relative to the criminal justice, child protection and relevant service delivery systems”.<sup>1</sup>

Each referral to Toba Centre may involve one or more forensic interviews. Over the past 5 years, we have conducted an average of 406 interviews per year. 503 child interviews were done at Toba Centre in 2022/23.<sup>2</sup> This is a 40% increase over the number of interviews conducted the previous year.

Toba Centre is developing a forensic interviewing mentorship program which will be offered to police and child welfare partners across the province. Those conducting forensic interviews at, or in conjunction with Toba Centre, will be expected to participate in the mentorship program – helping to build capacity across our province.

# Case Navigation

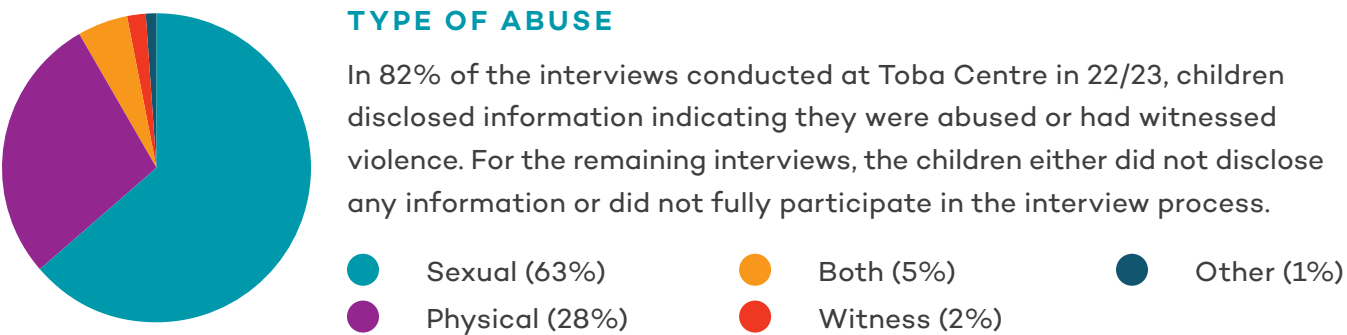
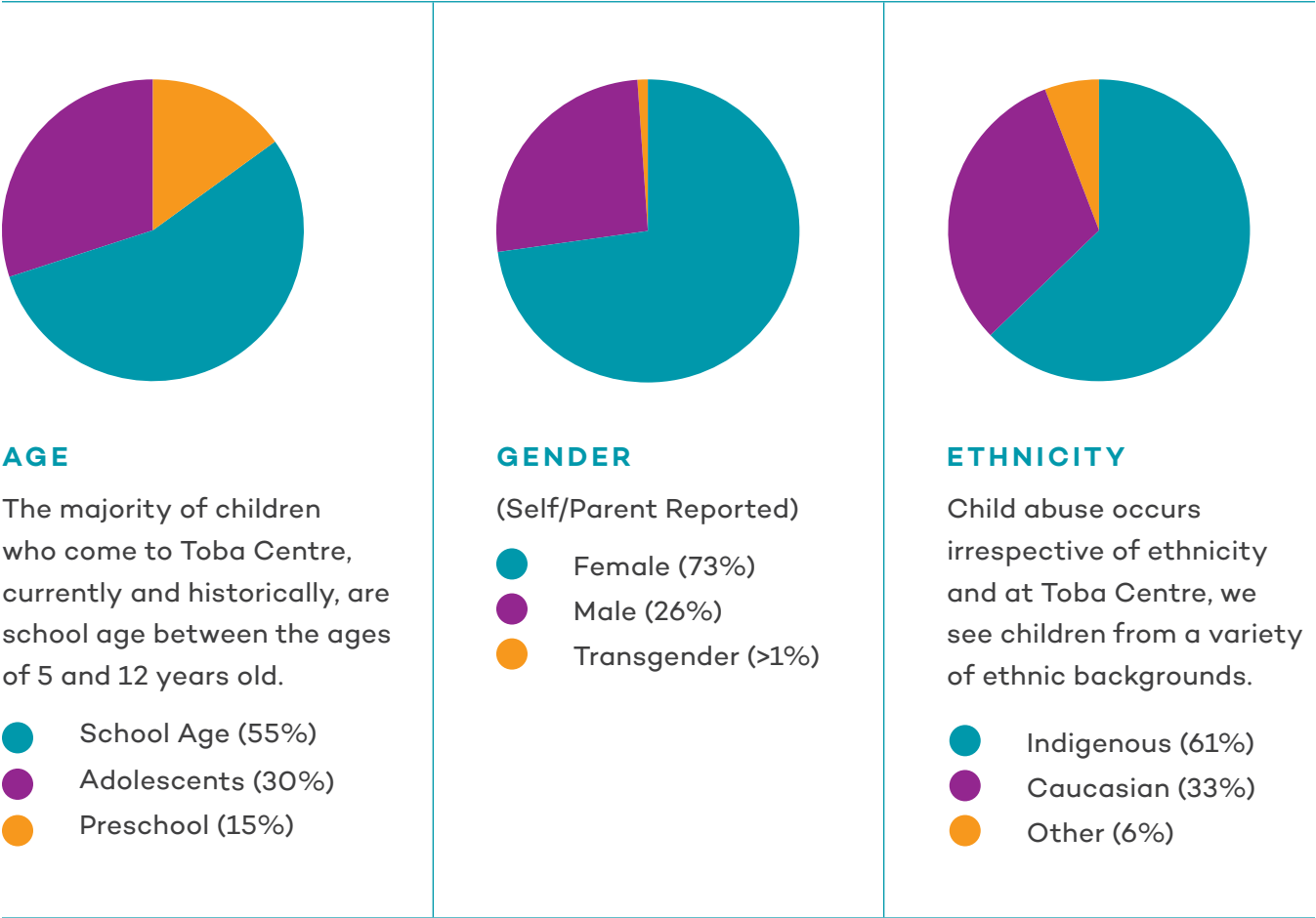
Providing victim support and advocacy is a key pillar within the child advocacy centre model and within Toba Centre, this support is provided through our Case Navigation Program. The objective of this program is to ensure the well-being and recovery of children/youth who have experienced abuse or witnessed violence, and that of their families/caregivers, is prioritized by providing consistent and continuous support to children and families/caregivers as they navigate the systems involved in the response to child abuse, as well as their individual journeys towards healing and justice.

A Case Navigator is assigned to every child/youth and their caregiver who attends Toba Centre. In 2022/23, Case Navigators met with 378 families/care providers on the day of the child/youth’s appointment at Toba Centre. Throughout the year, Case Navigators had contact with approximately 575 families/care providers (new families/care providers and existing families/care providers).
